MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Members,

It gives me pleasure to present the report for the year under review.

I apologise for the delay in refurbishing the entrance lobby after the collapse of the false ceiling. We have been attempting to locate the exact source of the leakage (which has been a problem at this spot for several years) in order that the same be plugged before doing up the lobby. We have consulted a water proofing expert, and have received his report, which has now been validated by one of our own Members, who is knowledgeable in this field. We hope to start work on the repair immediately, because I, myself, cringe every time I enter the Gymkhana.

We have also been receiving feedback from the Members - sometimes criticism - to the effect that the bar and restaurant on the ground floor appear dated and dull. The Managing Committee is in agreement that there is a necessity to uplift/refurbish both, the bar and the restaurant. As usual, it is a tradeoff between what is ideal and what is economically viable. The choice was between entirely redoing the bar and restaurant (would cost, may be, Rs. 2-2.5 crores) and refurbishing the same in a sensible manner with some value for money additions / changes. Considering our present state of finances, the Managing Committee has opted for the latter route. Since the total capital expenditure will cross Rs. 25 lakhs, we shall come back to the Members in an EGM for approval. My personal expectation of redoing the lobby, bar and restaurant would be a cost of approximately Rs. 50-60 lakhs.

On the sporting front, as far as cricket was concerned, it was impossible to live up to the previous season where the Gymkhana won an unprecedented four tournaments, and came close in a fifth. In the current year, we reached two finals, the Police Shield and the Talyarkhan Trophy, but were unsuccessful in both - but that is sports - we put our best foot forward on the field, but thereafter victory / defeat are to be treated as equal imposters and accepted gracefully either way. Our Table Tennis teams were far more successful and won both the men's and women's titles in the prestigious First Division, beating all opponents, and achieving this feat for the fourth successive year. Our Arm Wrestling Tournament continues its successful run, attracting participants from near and far. The Managing Committee is very keen to encourage every sporting Department, including outdoor sporting Departments other than cricket, to conduct activities and to continue to hold internal Tournaments with decent prizes. Badminton and Billiards/Snooker did make a start last year by holding an internal Tournament - we hope others follow suit.

Our booklets of Rules and Bye Laws have been updated till 31st March, 2023 and the same are available in the office, in case any Member desires to have them.

There is no surprise that we have been struggling with our cash flows post the pandemic, and the drastic reduction in the number of marriages/functions held on our grounds. Although far higher inquiries have been received in the current year, some clouds of uncertainty yet hang because one does not know what shape the coastal road, and possibly the service road, will take post the completion of construction. The only silver lining as far as finances are concerned, is that on account of the buoyancy in the stock markets, the value of our investment portfolio has kept increasing and remains our fallback in case of an emergency. I thank all past Finance Sub-Committees and the present one for their prudence in this matter.

I thank the staff for their sincere efforts during the year, as also the Managing Committee, particularly the office bearers, and the Departmental Secretaries for their efforts and dedication, often beyond the call of duty.

May our Gymkhana continue to fulfill its role as a sporting Institution.

ACCOUNTS AND FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Our Gymkhana's main source of income over the past many years has been from ground hire charges for marriages and other functions. Due to the ongoing work for the Coastal road project there has been an air of uncertainty regarding the viability of holding functions on the gymkhana ground due to various reasons. The entire service road has been taken over for expansion of main road, and once the Coastal road becomes operational, there is very little scope for the traffic police to grant permission due to resultant spilling over of vehicles from the Coastal road tunnel onto Marine Drive, and also due to constraints of parking facilities. This has been a major setback as far as income from marriage bookings is concerned. Hence, it is imperative for us to brace up to new challenges and look for other avenues to boost the Gymkhana's revenue. As far as our investments are concerned, their value continues to remain robust, as a major chunk of them are parked in Balanced Fund Schemes of Mutual Funds, and have better chances of remaining stable in spite of Equity Market fluctuations.

TABLE TENNIS:

Parsee Gymkhana continues its dominance in Table-tennis across all major formats - both at the club level as well as in the All-Parsee tournaments.

In the 8th Parsee Gymkhana All-Parsee Table-tennis tournament held on 11 and 12 February this year, our Gymkhana retained its top position in the main 3 events - Teams, Open singles and Open doubles. A month later on 11 and 12 March, in the Fozawac All-Parsee TT tournament at the Sir Ness Wadia Pavilion in Rustom Baug, your Gymkhana continued its excellent work by once again bagging the titles in the top 3 events.

In May, at the NSCI, Parsee Gymkhana - who were the enviable title holders in both men's and women's in the First Division of the Mumbai City District Interclub TT tournament - replicated its success for a phenomenal fourth successive year, beating the 'A' & 'B' teams of arch rivals MLWB in the men's event ! In the women's event, our pair of Senhora D'Souza and Manasi Chiplunkar ran through their opponents without dropping a set. (Frenaz Chipia was unavailable due to her Gujarat State Ranking tournament.)

Our star player Siddhesh Pande (who has represented India at the Commonwealth Games), won silver in teams and bronze in doubles at the Senior Nationals earlier this year. And, on 28th August this year, he was honoured with Maharashtra's highest and most prestigious - Shiv Chhatrapati Award for his excellence at the international, national and state level competitions - bringing glory for Maharashtra!

Zubin Taraporewalla, apart from bagging gold in teams in the State Championship, won 4 Thane District titles besides winning the Mumbai City District Inter-office tournament in the current season. Parthav Kelkar was runner-up in the State Ranking tournament at Sangli while his cousin Mayuresh won gold in the 5th District Ranking tournament.

Our women's team members too fared superbly this season. Manasi Chiplunkar won gold in the 3-star District Ranking tournament at the Indian Gymkhana, besides being runnerup in the District Ranking tournaments at the PJ Hindu Gymkhana and Matunga Gymkhana earlier this year.

Senhora D'Souza won gold in women's singles in the 5th Maharashtra State Ranking tournament at Sangli and also bagged the top prize in the All-India Public Sector tournament. Partnering Mamata Prabhu, and representing her employers Bank of Baroda, she won gold in the Mumbai City District Inter-office tournament at NSCI in May.

It's indeed a matter of great pride for the Gymkhana that our playing member Mamata Prabhu continues to be the Women's coach of the National team.

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES :

- a) The accounts are prepared on the basis of historical Cost Convention. All Income & Expenditure are accounted for on accrual basis.
- b) Entrance & Life Membership fee received from the members are credited to General Fund Account as per practice followed in the earlier years.

c) Fixed Assets :

Depreciation on items of Fixed Assets is provided for on the W.D.V. method at the rate prescribed by the Income Tax Act, 1961. Full year depreciation is charged on additions made to Fixed Asset before 30th September, 2022 and half year depreciation is charged on additions made to Fixed Asset after 30th September, 2022.

d) Investments :

Investments are accounted for at Cost. Dividends / Interest are accounted for on Accrual basis.

e) Retirement Benefit / Bonus :

Gratuity & Bonus payable to employees are accounted on cash basis.

- 2. The Gymkhana is an unincorporated organisation of members. It is assessed to Income Tax as association of persons and its income is considered on the concept of mutuality.
- 3. During the year electricity expenses is allocated to Billiards Room Expenses, Ground Expenses, Gymnasium Expenses, Badminton Court Expenses and Card Room Expenses on the basis of actual consumption.
- 4. Guest Fees includes General Guest Fees ₹ 11,08,788/- (*₹ 6,04,756/-).
